The Battalion left the United States on the 21st of June 1944 and arrived in Gorick, Scotland on the 28th of June 1944. The Battalion was stationed at Camp Stange in Knighton, Wales. The Battalion remained at Camp Stange from 29 June 1944 until 3 August when they left for the assembly area on the way to France. They left from Chickerall England aboard an LST on the 6th of August 1944. They arrived in France on the morning of the seventh and proceeded to the following towns until the present time.
